The Role

The High School Principal is the educational leader of grades 9–12, reporting directly to the President and, by extension, to the Board of Trustees, for the administration, operation, and educational and spiritual development of the academic, co-curricular, and formational programs in the high school. The Principal has comprehensive responsibility for the planning, coordination, and implementation of the high school's educational policies and academic standards. They also collaborate closely with the Middle School Principal to ensure curriculum alignment and consistency of the student experience. As a member of the school's leadership team, they must demonstrate an ability to articulate the value of a Jesuit education, play a leading role in fostering a community that embraces diversity and inclusion for all, and serve as an enthusiastic ambassador for our mission.

In keeping with its mission, Loyola Blakefield strives to recruit faculty and staff of diverse ethnic, religious, geographic, and socioeconomic backgrounds.

The ideal candidate will:

- Be an educator with an appreciation for, experience of, and commitment to the principles of Jesuit education and the unique role that Ignatian spirituality plays in the life of the school community.
- Be an educator with demonstrated administrative leadership, having at least a master's degree and a minimum five years of teaching experience at the secondary level.
- Be capable of working collaboratively within a school whose collegial administrative structures are well defined.
- Lead an active faith life with an ongoing commitment to spiritual growth and service to others.
- Possess a strong desire to serve as a visible member of the school community and assist in leading efforts to recruit, develop, and maintain superbly gifted academic personnel.
- Possess exceptional interpersonal, organizational, oral, and written communication skills.
- Possess knowledge and experience with strategic enrollment management.
- Possess the capacity to play a leading role in developing and guiding an academic, spiritual, service, and cocurricular student experience consistent with Jesuit education in the 21st century.

To Apply

Candidates must submit the following by February 15, 2021:

- 1. **Resume with cover letter** addressing qualifications and experiences ideally suited to the role.
- 2. **Three professional references** (name, relationship, telephone number, email address) who will only be contacted by permission of the candidate.
- 3. A brief (3–5 minute) video that expresses the candidate's passion for education, illuminates their proudest achievements and connections to Jesuit education, and notes any other personal or professional highlights relative to their interest and candidacy.
