



REACH SUMMER SESSION 2021: JOB ANNOUNCEMENT

Mission: REACH, through a transformative middle school program, empowers high-achieving young men from underserved communities as Catholic leaders committed to faith, scholarship, and service. A summer and Saturday access program run through Regis High School, REACH serves students whose families demonstrate significant financial need. REACH currently serves 147 students from the 6th to 8th grade, with the ultimate aim of placing each student in a Catholic high school with a scholarship or financial aid. In keeping with the 450-year old Jesuit educational tradition that honors *cura personalis*, REACH serves its students and alumni by caring for their intellectual, spiritual, emotional and social development.

Summer Session: The 6-week summer session consists of a 3-week boarding component either at the University of Scranton in Pennsylvania or at Fordham University in the Bronx (both from July 8th to July 29th), and a 3-week day component at Regis High School in Manhattan (August 2nd – August 20th). The session brings together 200 middle school students for accelerated course work. Due to the ongoing pandemic, there is a possibility that all six weeks will take place at Regis with social distancing measures. The following summer positions are available:

6th Grade Math or ELA (6 weeks): At Fordham and/or Regis, the teacher will teach two sections of Math or ELA to rising 6th grade students. A curriculum with instructional resources is provided. Class sizes are limited to 10.

7th thru 9th Grade Math or ELA (6 weeks): At Scranton and/or Regis, the teacher will teach two sections of Math or ELA to rising 7th, 8th or 9th grade students. A curriculum with instructional resources is provided. Class sizes are limited to 15.

Compensation: Faculty and staff receive a stipend of \$4,680 for the summer. For the 7th thru 9th grade positions, faculty are provided with comfortable housing in university apartments at the University of Scranton and three meals per day in the university dining hall; faculty are asked to remain on campus for one of the three Scranton weekends. For the 6th grade positions, faculty members are expected to work at Fordham Preparatory School from 8:40 am-3:00 pm and to assist with one weekend field trip. At Regis, faculty hours are generally 8:50 am to 4:30pm.

Qualifications: Preferred qualifications include an academic degree in your field of teaching interest, at least three years of middle or high school teaching experience in the given field, experience in teaching academically gifted students, experience teaching students from diverse ethnic backgrounds, and a demonstrated commitment to the REACH mission.
